Traits refer to observed consistency of behaviour. According to Eysenck, trait is "**an observed constellation of individual action tendencies**". Traits are not directly observed rather Inferred from behaviour of person. General cues to the traits are what the person does, how he does it and how well he does it ?

Several traits together constitute a dimension of personality which helps us in making distinction among persons. Trait theory studies personality by its location or position on a number of scales, each of which represents a trait.

4. To give the suggestion to B.Ed. student teachers for these personality development

Scope and limitations

- 1) This study was conducted on the student teachers studying in SVCS B.Ed. College Solapur in 2012-13 batch
- 2) Singh's Differential Personality Inventory was used to collect the necessary data.

Research Procedure

The present Researchers have used Singh's Differential Personality Inventory which is a standard test for collecting the necessary data. The Inventory was administered on 30 B.Ed. Student Teachers studying in 2012-13 batch of SVCS BEd College Solapur.

Method of Research:

As the main objective of this study was to find out the present status of different personality factors of B.Ed. Student Teachers. Therefore, School Survey under Descriptive Method was used.

Tool

Singh's Differential Personality Inventory (SDPI) a Standard Test containing different Personality Factors like stability. Masculinity. Friendliness, . Heterosexuality, Ego, Strength, Curiosity, Dominance, , self Concept, was used to collect the data from the respondents .

Sample

The present research is based on data collected from 30 students of B Ed student teachers of B Ed Batch 2012-13 of SVCS BEd College Solapur

FINDINGS:

- 1) In case of Decisiveness 3.33% of the respondents were very High & 4.33% were Unsatisfactory
- 2) In case of Responsibility 30.33% of the respondents were very High, & 4.33% were Unsatisfactory
- 3) In case of Emotional Stability 26.6% of the respondents were very High, & 10.00% were Unsatisfactory
- 4) In case of Masculinity 10.00% of the respondents were very High, & 46.6 % were Unsatisfactory
- 5) In case of Friendliness 43.00% of the respondents were very High, & 16.6 % were Unsatisfactory

- 6) In case of Hetero sexuality 3.33% of the respondents were very High, & 66.66 % were Unsatisfactory
- 7) In case of Ego – Strength 16.7% of the respondents were very High, & 53.3 % were Unsatisfactory
- 8) In case of Curiosity 20.00% of the respondents were very High, & 50.00 % were Unsatisfactory
- 9) In case of Dominance 33.33% of the respondents were very High, & 30.00 % were Unsatisfactory
- 10) In case of Self Concept 6.66% of the respondents were very High, & 36.66 % were Unsatisfactory.

CONCLUSION

From the above findings, it can be conceded that, Majority of the respondents (43.3%) are very high in the personality dimensions of FRIENDLINESS, Majority of the respondents (66.66) % UNSATISFACTORY in the din of HETEROSEXUALITY. If institution provides proper guidelines to student teacher's, we can develop their personality in a desirable direction.
