We apply a survey method to analyze the data. The analysis of the data is represented graphically because it is easy to evaluate the sports facilities is available. The sample of the Study was 20 Colleges (10 Government and 10 Private Colleges) Selected throw random sampling technique. Percentage method was used to analyze the data. The results revealed that Private Colleges of Bareilly District

are ahead in availability as well as in providing of facilities to the sports person/students for the promotion of games and sports.

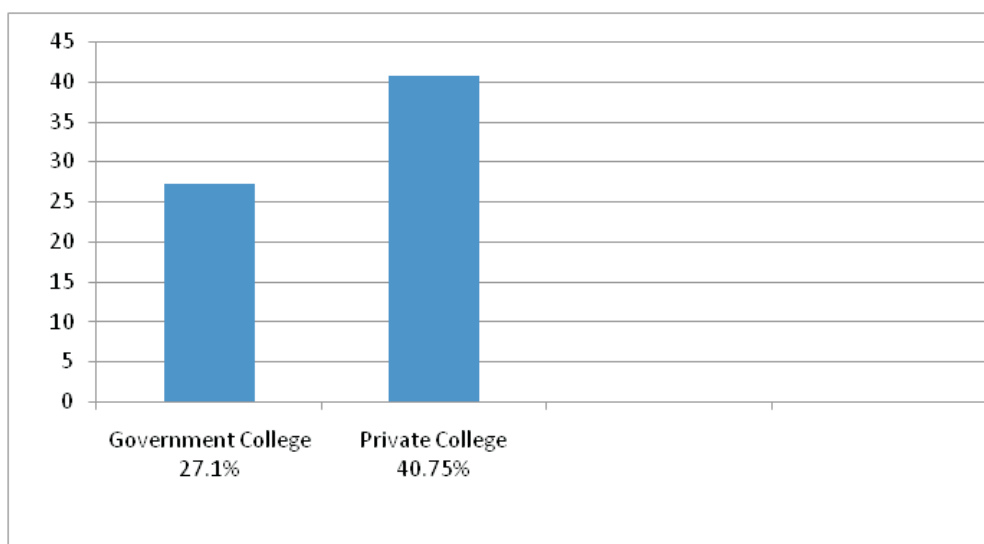


Fig. No.-1: Graphical representation shows average percentage of available infrastructure in Government and Privet Colleges of Bareilly District.

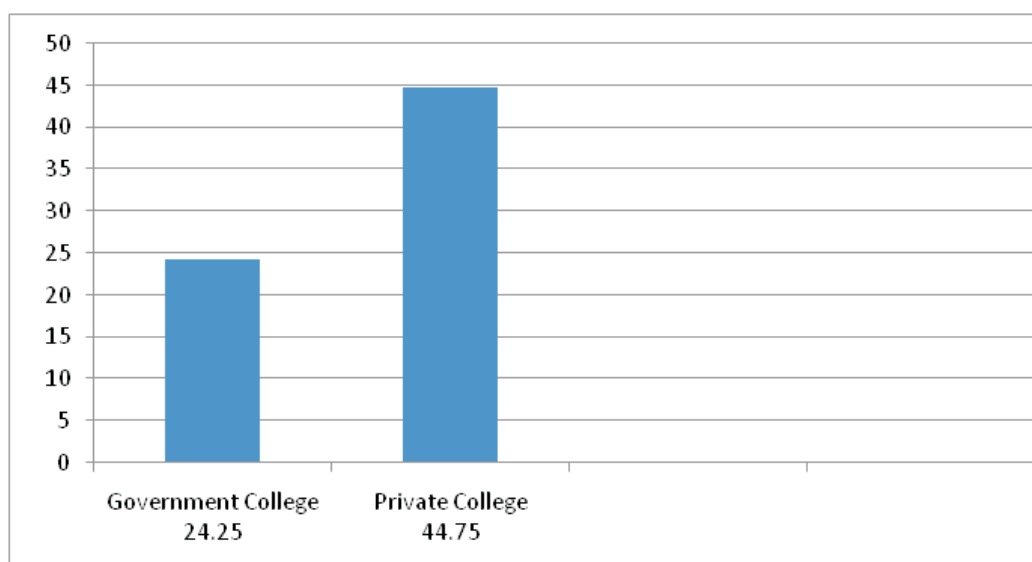


Fig. No.-2: Graphical representation shows average percentage of sports facilities Provided in Government and Privet Colleges of Bareilly District.
